

What do you want to do?	Shortcut
Alternate between displaying cell values and displaying cell formulas	CTRL + `
Change the type of cell reference from relative to absolute or semi-absolute	F4
Collapse the ribbon (press again to expand)	CTRL + F1
Copy a formula from above cell and edit	CTRL + '
Debug portions of a formula (select and press)	F9
Display range names (can be used when typing formulas)	F3
Display the formula palette after you type a valid function name in a formula	CTRL + A
Evaluate formulas. (its easy to remember when working with some "tuf" formulas!)	ALT + TUF
Fills down value from cell above	CTRL + D
Format as number with 2 dp	CTRL + SHIFT + 1
Format Selection (cells, objects, charts)	CTRL + 1
Freeze panes	ALT + WFF
Hide column	CTRL + 0
Hide row	CTRL + 9
Insert hyperlink	CTRL + K
Keep filter on columns, but show all rows	ALT + DFS
Paste values only	ALT + ESV
Repeat whatever you did last	F4
Save as	F12
Select a continuous range of data, no matter where your cursor stands in the array	CTRL + *
Select all cells that are directly or indirectly referred to by formulas in the selection	CTRL + SHIFT + {
Select all cells with formulas that refer directly or indirectly to the active cell	CTRL + SHIFT + }
Select all dependent cells	CTRL +]
Select all precedent cells	CTRL + [
Select array formula range	CTRL + /
Select blank cells	F5 + ALT + S + K + ENTER
Select the whole column	CTRL + SPACE
Select the whole row	SHIFT + SPACE
Sets/removes strikeout in current cell	CTRL + 5
Show in-cell drop down with previously entered values	ALT + Down arrow
Single border around selected cells	CTRL + SHIFT + 7
To wrap lines	ALT + HW (2007+)
Turn filter on or off	CTRL + SHIFT + L
